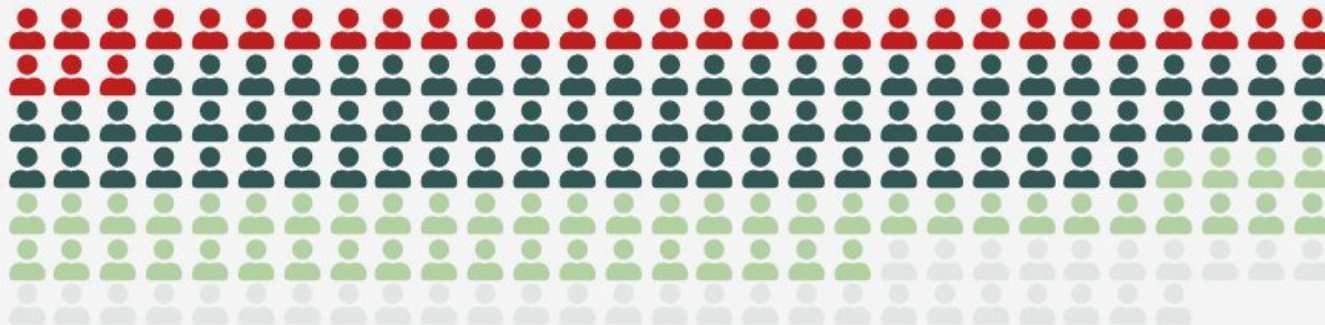

Britons do not want a Trump presidency to derail UK climate action

If the United States scales back its climate action under a Trump presidency, **two in three Britons think the UK's global action on climate change should increase or stay the same.** When it comes to UK and US foreign policy, the public is five times as likely to say the UK should try to influence US foreign policy by leading the way rather than follow the lead of the Americans.

What do Britons want the UK to do on climate if Trump wins the US election?

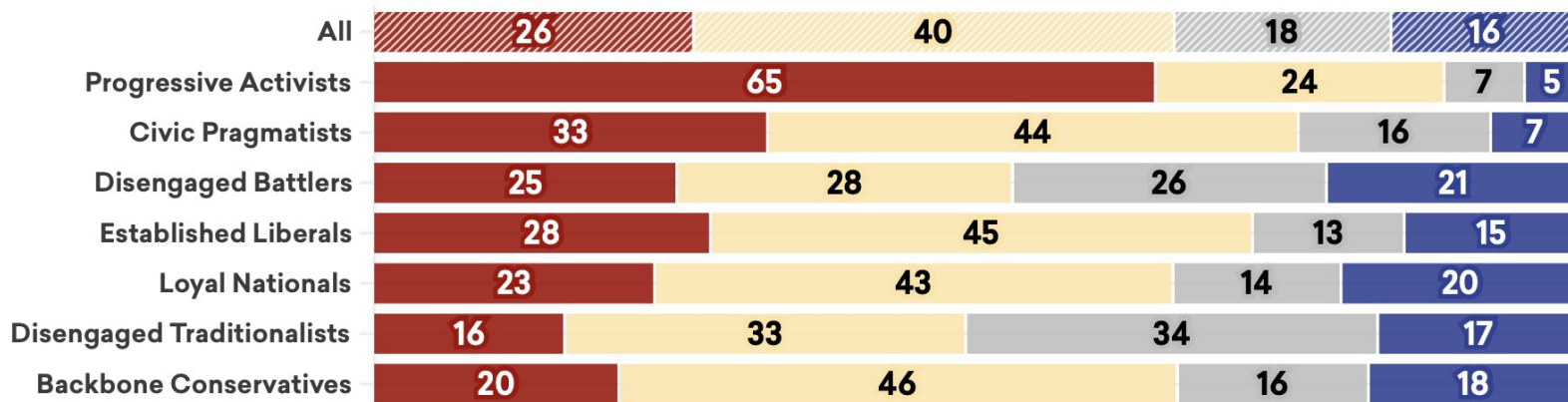

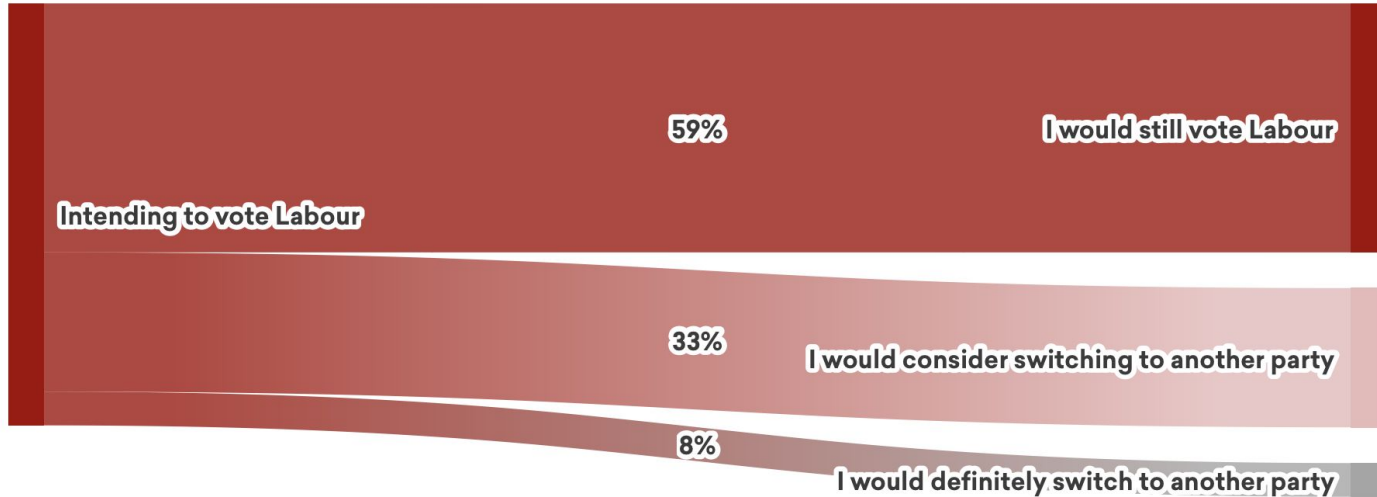
- Increase our global action on climate change
